Year 10 student completes the 828 mile Iceland Ring Road Challenge!

Congratulations to AD-S, in Year 10 who completed the Iceland Ring Road Challenge. He enjoys running and even with all the rigid restrictions in place during the Lockdown he stayed motivated and dedicated to completing the 828 mile challenge.

The Ring Road Virtual Challenge takes participants on an 828 mile (1,332 km) road trip around Iceland.

Each time a participant completes a distance-based exercise such as running, walking, cycling, swimming, etc they advance along the map of the Ring Road in Iceland. For every 20% of the route that each participant completes the challenge organisers make a donation toward the planting of a tree. By the end of the challenge each participant will have helped plant five trees. Since the challenge began in August 2020 funds have been raised to plant more than 450,000 trees.



By completing the challenge AD-S raised the funds to plant five trees, so as well as keeping himself fit he is also helping to keep the planet fit. He plans on taking part in another virtual challenge, so good luck!

Student Rewards

Well done to all our students for their brilliant effort since returning to school. As a result, teachers have been handing out lots of achievement points. Peer-on-peer harassment is harassment that happens between children of a similar age or stage of development. It can happen between any number of children, and can affect any age group.

It can be harmful to the children who display it as well as those who experience it.

Children can experience peer-on-peer harassment in a wide range of settings, including:

- at school
- at home or in someone else's home
- in public spaces
- Online (Reference: NSPCC)

Behaviour of this type is unacceptable at Gladesmore. The government document, 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' highlights the steps that schools should take to address the issue if it should occur in schools.

We understand that academic qualifications are important, however, we also recognise that academic qualifications on their own will not fully prepare young people for the modern world. We therefore consider Personal, Social & Health Education (PSHE) is an incredibly important subject for our pupils. Whilst Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) has only been statutory since September 2020, we have been teaching PSHE for more than 15 years.

PSHE is an incredibly broad subject which also contains our Citizenship provision. Students learn about wider educational matters including how to keep healthy and safe. It is impossible to detail here all of the content covered in PSHE, however, the statutory content can be found on the GCS website in the Curriculum section. PSHE typically teaches lessons on topics such as first aid; healthy relationships; strategies to manage wellbeing; dental hygiene; the risks of online gambling; cyber-safety; parenting and the importance of family relationships.

As part of our implementation of statutory RSE, we are keen to gain feedback from parents. The policy itself can be found in the Policies & Documents section of the website including information regarding the right to withdraw.
