County lines: what you need to know

Children of all ages and backgrounds are at risk of being exploited by criminal gangs who'll use them to transport drugs and money around the country. This is 'county lines' in a nutshell. Despite the coronavirus pandemic, gangs have continued to exploit children, so it's important you know what it is and what signs to look out for.

What are the signs I should be looking out for?

If your child is affected by county lines exploitation, there may be some signs. Here are some key indicators that you should look out for.

Is your child:

Returning home late, staying out all night or going missing?	Receiving unexplained money, phone(s), clothes or jewellery?
Being found in areas away from home?	Increasingly disruptive or aggressive?
Increasing their drug use, or being found to have large amounts of drugs on them?	Using language that you wouldn't expect them to know?
Being secretive about who they are talking to and where they are going?	Coming home with injuries or looking particularly dishevelled?
Having unexplained absences from school or college?	Having hotel cards or keys to unknown places?

What should I do if I suspect my child is being exploited?

Report your concerns to children's social care at:

A social worker will be able to listen to your concerns and help you to protect your child

- Contact our school. Ask to speak to the designated safeguarding lead and explain your concerns to them. They will be able to advise you where to go next
- Contact your local police station or call 101. If your child is missing, remember you don't have to wait 24 hours before making a report

LAET Science Partnership update

In Science, Year 9 and 10 students have been working with the Chemistry department at London Academy of Excellence Tottenham (LAET) to further their understanding of structures in chemistry and chemical reactions.

Our Year 10 students are currently exploring the science behind gemstones through a series of sessions at LAET. One participating student described the experience as 'an incredible opportunity to gain insight into such a fascinating aspect of science and apply deeper context to what we learn at GCSE'.

Year 9 students have enthusiastically tackled escape room challenges to stretch and extend their understanding of atoms and chemical reactions. Students have excelled at answering GCSE and A-level questions which has taken them above and beyond the KS3 curriculum. The final session was a practical activity which took place at London Academy of Excellence where students had the exciting opportunity to carry out chromatography in an A-level laboratory.

Chromatography is a separation technique used to identify the colours in a

mixture of inks or dyes. It has applications in crime scene analysis and food standards regulation. On this occasion students separated food dyes from the shells of M&M sweets. Students demonstrated brilliant practical skills as they worked through a complicated procedure to produce a colourful chromatogram.

It has been fantastic for so many of our students to experience science sessions at LAET this academic year and next year we are looking forward to building on this success.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS



If your child is entitled to free school meals you could be saving on average £10 per week or £390 per year

To qualify you MUST receive ONE of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31st March 2023.
